SUMMARY

As a result of heightened law enforcement activity surrounding the Rodney King civil rights trial verdict, the Police Department worked over 160,000 overtime hours, incurring approximately \$5.5 million in costs (\$5,275,000 sworn, \$275,000 civilian). On June 4, 1993, the Board of Police Commissioners transmitted a request to the Mayor for an appropriation of \$5.5 million to pay for the overtime. Upon reviewing this request, we have determined that the Department's cost estimate needs refinement and that the amount of overtime owed will probably be lower.

The Department currently is in the process of determining the City's actual cash overtime obligation and expects to have the information available through the Controller's payroll system by mid-August. In order to expedite the payment, the Department is requesting authorization to use 1993-94 budgeted overtime funds for this purpose in advance of the determination of the actual amount needed. With such authorization, the Department can begin the payment process as soon as the Controller's report is available. Thereafter, the Department would request reimbursement of the funds expended.

A portion of this cost will be reimbursed to the City from federal sources. The Department was notified on July 22 by the California Office of Criminal Justice Planning that \$452,397 would be made available to the City to partially pay for sworn overtime costs incurred. An application for this funding is under preparation at this time by the Department with the assistance of the Mayor's Criminal Justice Planning Office.

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Council:

- Authorize the Police Department to compensate in cash the overtime incurred as a result of the 1. Rodney King civil rights trial verdict, April 8-19, 1993, using 1993-94 budgeted funds; and,
- Authorize the Police Department to submit to the Mayor and Council a request for reimbursement 2. from the Reserve Fund for funds thus expended after the final cash overtime obligation and the amount expended have been determined.

REQUEST FOR APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS - KING TRIAL OVERTIME

At a regular meeting of the Board of Police Commissioners held June 1, 1993, this Board considered and approved a request to appropriate \$5.5 million to Police Department Fund 100, Account No. 1092, Overtime-Police Officers (\$5,275,000) and 1091, Overtime-General (\$275,000), for the purpose of paying in cash the sworn and civilian Department personnel who worked overtime associated with the Rodney King Civil Rights trial verdict.

In approving the report, the Board emphasized the criticality of maintaining the Department's compensatory overtime balance at its current level to maximize officer availability. Authorizing cash compensation for overtime worked in conjunction with this request will ensure that limited police resources are not further depleted.

Honorable Members:

It is recommended that the Board of Police Commissioners approve and transmit to the Mayor and City Council a request that authority be granted to the Police Department to pay cash to those sworn and civilian personnel who worked overtime associated with the Rodney King civil rights trial verdict. To facilitate this action, it is further requested that \$5.5 million be appropriated to Police Department Fund 100, Account No. 1092, Overtime - Police Officers (\$5,275,000) and 1091, Overtime - General (\$275,000).

Based on overtime requests received to date and an assessment of requests yet to be processed through the City payroll system, the staff projects that a total of \$5.5 million will be needed to pay all overtime worked during the subject mobilization for both sworn and civilian employees. This amount includes overtime worked during the partial (April 9-16) and full (April 17-18) mobilization periods.

An appropriation is necessary to address this unusual major event because the Department's 1992-93 Budget is insufficiently financed to cover these expenses. It should be noted, however, that the request may be reduced somewhat pending determination of the City's share of \$1 million which has become available for distribution to Los Angeles County agencies by the State Office of Criminal Justice Planning.

SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES AND COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE KING

CIVIL RIGHTS TRIAL

The Emergency Operating Center (EOC) was activated at 8:00 a.m. on April 8, 1993, and deactivated at 12:00 noon on April 19, 1993, to coordinate City activities associated with the trial of three current and one former Los Angles Police Department officers accused of violating Rodney King's civil rights. The City's EOC was activated for 11.5 days to coordinate interdepartmental and inter-jurisdictional response needs. Section A/103.05 of the Emergency Operations Master Plan and Procedures requires each involved Emergency Operations Organization (EOO) division to submit a report on activities and costs incurred during the EOC activation to the City Administrative Officer (CAO) and for the CAO to compile and present the reports to the Chairman of the Emergency Operations Board (EOB) and the Mayor.

All EOO divisions (except Airports and Recovery and Reconstruction), the Library and Information Services Departments, and the Office of the City Administrative Officer (CAO) have reported activities and costs associated with this EOC activation. The total City costs were \$6,847,224. Of this, \$5,881,833 was for the Police Department. The next highest reported costs were for the Fire Department at \$221,271. The Departments of General Services and Transportation, reported costs of \$214,315 and \$205,900, respectively. Of the \$214,315 reported by the Transportation Department, \$158,500 was lost revenue from a two day withdrawal of Traffic Officers from the field.

The principal activities associated with this EOC activation were the increased deployment of personnel for security reasons, other security measures, logistical support (food) for on-duty personnel, EOC staffing and an emergency EOB meeting on April 17.

The Police Department is continuing to pursue efforts to obtain partial reimbursement of its expenses from the California Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP). OCJP reimbursement, if any, is expected to be less than one million dollars.

BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT relative to compensation of police overtime associated with the Rodney King civil rights trial verdict, April 8-19, 1993.

Recommendations for Council action:

As recommended by the CAO:

- AUTHORIZE the Police Department to compensate in cash the overtime incurred as a result of the Rodney King civil rights trial verdict, April 8-19, 1993, using 1993-94 budgeted funds.
- 2. AUTHORIZE the Police Department to submit to the Mayor and Council a request for reimbursement from the Reserve Fund for funds thus expended after the final cash overtime obligation and the amount expended have been determined.

As recommended by the Committee:

Relative to previous Council action approving application for State grant funds (C.F. 92-0800-S11) to partially reimburse sworn overtime costs incurred in this matter, INSTRUCT the Police Department to substitute the City's policy regarding Police handling of undocumented workers under arrest and request the State to accept the City's policy, in lieu of the State's policy which would require the Police Department to notify the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) at the booking stage for determination of resident status of suspected undocumented workers.

SUMMARY

In his report dated 7-26-93, the City Administrative Officer (CAO) stated that as a result of heightened law enforcement activity surrounding the Rodney King civil rights trial verdict, the Police Department worked over 160,000 overtime hours, incurring what was at time of CAO's report approximately \$5.5 million in costs. On June 4, 1993, the Board of Police Commissioners transmitted a request to the Mayor for an appropriation of \$5.5 million to pay for said overtime. The CAO opined that the amount of overtime owed will probably be lower (subsequently determined to be approximately \$4.4 million).

In order to expedite the payment, the Department is requesting authorization to use 1993-94 budgeted overtime funds for this purpose in

advance of determining the actual amount needed. authorization, the Department can begin the payment process as soon as the Controller's report determining actual cash overtime obligation is Thereafter, the Department would request reimbursement of available. the funds expended.

The CAO stated that a portion of this cost is reimbursable to the City from Federal sources administered through the State. The Calif. Office of Criminal Justice Planning has informed the City that \$452,397 is available to the City to offset sworn overtime costs incurred. application for this funding is being prepared by the Department and the Mayor's Criminal Justice Planning Office, and was subsequently approved by the Council in a separate action (C.F. 92-0800-S11).

At the Budget and Finance Committee meeting of 8-10-93, the Committee was given updated information that the final amount to be reimbursed from the Reserve Fund will be approximately \$4.4 million (as opposed to \$5.5 million originally estimated). The Police Department informed the Committee that they are processing paperwork for the \$452,397 in grant funds from the State via Federal sources as partial reimbursement for sworn overtime costs incurred (as authorized under C.F. 92-0800-S11).

However, staff has learned of a newly-released State policy when awarding criminal justice grant funds to the City - that as a condition of receiving such funds, the Police Department would be required to notify the INS at the booking stage for determination of resident status of suspected undocumented workers. The Department informed the Committee that inasmuch as there exists a City policy antithetical to this kind of Police action, they are submitting the grant application substituting the City's policy for that being asked for in the grant The Committee approved the Police Department's plan in application. this regard.

After discussion, the Committee concurred with the recommendations of the City Administrative Officer and submits this matter for Council consideration.
