Dear Ms. Parker:

We received your November 3, 2023 Public Records Act request for the following records:

I hereby request, under Division 10 (commencing with Section 7920.000) of Title 1 of the Government Code (also known as the "California Public Records Act"), copies of **all documents retained by the Commission on Equity, Inclusion, and Social Justice (CEISJ)**, not otherwise exempt from disclosure. Many of these documents would be held by AVP Cecil Chik, and would likely have been uploaded to systems under the control of the University (such as Google Drive) around mid-October.

CSU has conducted a reasonable search for these records under Government Code §7922.535 and has determined the request calls for documents that are not disclosable under the Public Records Act.

As a committee member, I understand you have access to all requested documents except for the

raw data, which is exempt from production due to General Privacy Rights. Cal. Govt. Code §7927.705; Cal. Const. Art. 1, §1.

The remaining documents are not disclosable because they reflect CSU's deliberative decision-making process, which often involves multiple individuals who must converse candidly. Cal. Govt. Code §7922.000; *Times Mirror Co. v. Superior Court* (1991) 53 Cal.3d 1325; *Montrose Chemical Corporation of California v. Train* (D.DC 1982) 491 F.2d 63; *Rogers v. Superior Court* (1993) 19 Cal. App.4th 469.

The decision that records are exempt and will not be disclosed was made by the Records Access Officer at CSU Fullerton, Anne Grogan.

Under GOV 7922.535(a), the records must be provided within ten calendar days; as such, please provide the records by no later than November 10, 2023 (with intentional delays to or beyond that point prohibited by GOV 7922.500).
